A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Hey now,

As I said last week my recent trip to Chicago once again impacted me in many ways. The sights, sounds and yes, even smells, reminded me of the wonders of the city where I was nurtured. This time as in times past, there were particular details that stood out prominently and made me wonder. As I found myself going out and about each day it never failed that I was stuck in traffic by a train. This occurred no matter what route I took, but this should not be surprising as Chicago was the key hub of transport by rail to the places west of the Mississippi. This time afforded me the opportunity to just sit and take in the sights of the city that has not only changed, but also aged in the past few decades. As the freight cars were slowly rolling down the tracks I thought of the various goods they carried, the globalization of manufacturing that enabled these articles to travel around the world and of course graffiti. (As you can tell, depending on the speed of these locomotives and their cargo, I had quite a bit of time to think.)

Almost all of the cars were peppered with some form of “street art.” However, most of this “art” was not of the type you would see hanging in the Art Institute downtown, but it no doubt was painted there for others to see. When one would see this, they would be forewarned that this area or this property was claimed by a particular street gang, and that others should know this was their territory. This type of declaration was not new to me as it was, and still is to a certain extent, placed upon garages in the neighborhood to say which gangs call this their haunts. While some of the gang names have changed the purpose of their existing still remains the same: to give to people a sense of belonging and security who believe they cannot find it anywhere else. (Some even provide money through their dealings that provides the impetus to join.)

Wouldn't it be wonderful if the world provided this comfort and belonging, this human need, in a positive way to build up life instead of those that take life away? For how many of these, our sisters and brothers, may have followed a different path if they were nurtured by family, church and community instead of in some instances shunned by them. However, this isn't only a thought directed at gang members but humanity in general. From the earliest recorded history we hear of people who have banded together for a particular cause. They have marked their territory and in most if not all instances life has been lost defending this prized possession. Time and energy are then directed to edifying their stronghold in anticipation of an ever larger assault on their land. This is the way that our nation was founded and built and continues to be defended from the onslaught that is at our door.

There is nothing inherently wrong with forming alliances with people who have similar beliefs or creeds. A sense of owning a particular piece of property shows accomplishment and signifies a desire to belong to a specific community which provides a good feeling. Even having some way of showing off our differences and marking the area asks for respect and hopefully shows our willingness to treat others with that same courtesy. Yet when any of these thoughts and actions becomes a way of excluding someone who is different, threatening those who dare to enter our space or be used as our justification to injure others then are we better than a street thug or terrorist that we detest?

The world around us will naturally age and deteriorate. (This doesn't include plastic bags which seem to have a half-life of 500,000 years.) We will grow old and eventually pass from this life to the next. Wouldn't we prefer to leave a legacy that is filled with “art” to soothe and comfort instead of that which embitters another and makes them disgusted? Would we rather have people remember us for the fences we put up or the walls we helped bring down? Is our journey of faith upon this earth meant to give life or to take it? We can spend time marking these transitory objects on this earth that is not ours, or we can instead celebrate how we have been signed with the love of God and seek to share that with our sisters and brothers.

Preparing for the New Translation of the Mass: Acclamation of Faith

On the First Sunday of Advent, November 27, 2011, Catholic parishes in the United States will begin praying the texts of the Mass using a new English translation of The Roman Missal. In the most general sense, what will change is some of the Mass language; most of the words of the priest and the responses of the faithful will not change. The structure will not change nor will the liturgical content or meaning of the Mass change.

So, if that’s what won’t change, what will, and why? Let’s look at the answers in reverse order; first, why change language that has been in place for over 40 years? To answer that, we need to back up to what is the purpose of the words of our Mass liturgy? A useful way to keep the changes in context is this:

Our liturgical “words” in the Mass are to help us better understand and become closer to “The Word” (Logos in the original Greek), which is our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. So, as always, our words should lead us to the Word Incarnate, Jesus.

Keep in mind that the current and new languages are both based on the original Latin text that has been in place for centuries. Over time (decades) Church leaders and groups have reviewed, prayed about, and considered the original English translation done after Vatican II in the mid 1960s. Translation is a very difficult art and science! But, put simply, the new wording changes try to get closer to the Latin text’s original meaning.

The changes, because they are different, should cause us to think about and reflect on their meanings to us individually and as church, the body of Christ on earth. While this may initially be awkward, the new language should “point” us towards Christ and renew our spiritual development and deepen our participation in the mystery of the Mass and Eucharist.

Weekly we will be talking about the changes, both the “what” and the “why.” We hope that these articles help all parishioners prepare for, understand, and take spiritual advantage of our central worship focus – the Mass and the Eucharist. This week, we will look more closely at some of the changes in the words and phrases that we will pray during the Acclamation of Faith.

Beginning the first Sunday of Advent, our responses (there are three possible ones) to the priest’s invitation, “Let us proclaim the mystery of Faith” will change somewhat. Below are the current responses followed by the new translations in bold type.

The current 4th acclamation (“Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.”) will not have a counterpart in the new translations. While it is a strong statement of faith about Christ, it was felt that it was not, as the others are and will be, a prayer to Him.

However, tax legislation enacted in December 2010 extends the opportunity throughout 2011 for individuals 70½ years old or older to make a direct distribution from your IRA to a qualified charity, such as St. Benedict Catholic Church or the St. Benedict Catholic Church Endowment Fund at the Catholic Community Foundation (Account #90P015DN8.) Such qualified direct distributions to charity from your IRA are not subject to income tax.
