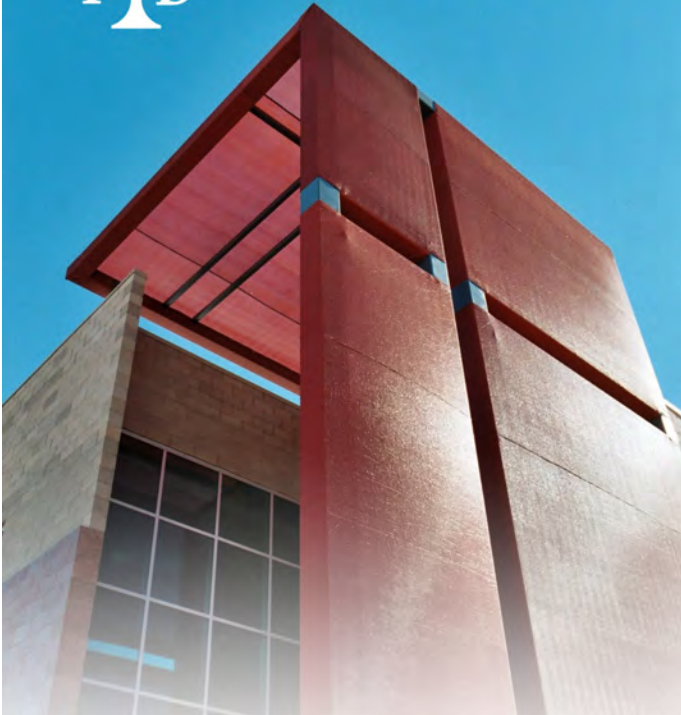

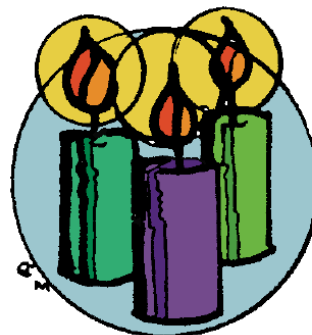

## A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Hey now,

A few weeks ago I had the opportunity to take a drive down to Tucson. Usually I do not have the call to make this trip often, but the few times per year that I must navigate south and east on I-10 are more than enough. While the distance is nearly sixty miles less than my more frequent trips to Flagstaff, it seems that the drive takes longer going to the previous capital of the Arizona Territory. There are a few reasons that are apparent which I have come up with to explain this phenomenon. In driving northward one has to go for nearly forty-five minutes before leaving the Phoenix area (notice the use of the word 'area' to cover the city of Phoenix proper and what would be called suburbs that surround the city; another example is the Chicagoland area). So as one begins the climb out of Black Canyon City it makes it feel as if the trip is only just beginning.

One other aspect of heading to the North Country is the unceasing twists, turns, curves, inclines and declines that keep one from boredom. However, as many know the road to Tucson is mostly a straight and uninteresting road (except for the occasional haboob that makes it a white knuckle ride) that can cause a hypnotic trance. Yet I was pleasantly surprised on this most recent jaunt by something that may seem extraordinary coming from me and that is the gift of music.

Yes, you may say haven't I been listening to the Grateful Dead channel on these mind-numbing exploits, and you would be correct. Yet this recent voyage opened up something that while I heard rumors of their existence actually came into contact with them. There are numerous other channels on satellite radio that have music with which I am familiar and enjoy. During a broadcast of "The Golden Road," a call in show for Dead Heads, I needed something more than talk radio to keep myself from falling asleep at the wheel, running off the road and being impaled by a beautiful saguaro. So I turned and found channels like: 'Classic Vinyl,' 'Classic Rewind,' and 'The Joint.' (This last station is a Reggae station for those who are wondering.)

These stations helped me to focus yet again on the trek that was ahead, and it was good to hear some digitally-remastered versions of old favorites. Although we all know that there is nothing like the excitement that one feels as you see a stylus gently waft down and encounter a spinning 33 1/3 vinyl disk, and that characteristic scratchy noise is emitted through the speakers. Yes this diversity of music brought a smile to my face, memories to mind and a rhythmic beat in my soul. This new discovery brightened up not only my foray, but reminded me yet again of the diversity of the Spirit of our loving God.

Our God invites us to change the channel every once in awhile and groove to the beat of a different drummer. That beat may remind us of the tremendous sounds that came from other groups besides the Grateful Dead. That undulation may inspire us to hear the beauty of an accented voice which we may have turned off previously. The pitch of an instrument may invite us to listen to the sing-song quality of the languages of the world and despite the differences we may realize that we are all called to use the language of love that is our God. Go ahead and change from your favorite station. I can attest the music will be there when you return, but in the interim a new song will possibly soothe your soul.

## Preparing for the New Translation of the Mass: Sign of Peace, Invitation to Communion & Concluding Rites

On the First Sunday of Advent, November 27, 2011, Catholic parishes in the United States will begin praying the texts of the Mass using a new English translation of The Roman Missal. In the most general sense, what will change is some of the Mass language; most of the words of the priest and the responses of the faithful will not change. The structure will not change nor will the liturgical content or meaning of the Mass change.

This is the final part of our Roman Missal series. We hope that these articles have helped all parishioners prepare for, understand, and take spiritual advantage of our central worship focus – the Mass and the Eucharist. This week, we will look more closely at the changes in the words and phrases that we will pray during the Sign of Peace, Invitation to Communion and Concluding Rites.

There are no changes to the “Our Father!” However there are some changes to the Sign of Peace, Invitation to Communion and Concluding Rites.

At the Sign of Peace the priest’s words are slightly different. “Lord Jesus Christ, / who said to your Apostles, / Peace I leave you, my peace I give you, /look not on our sins, / but on the faith of your Church, /and graciously grant her peace and unity / in accordance with your will. / Who live and reign for ever and ever.” The congregation will respond, “Amen.” When the priest then says, “The peace of the Lord be with you always” (no change), we reply, “And with your spirit.”

“Behold the Lamb of God” is closer to the Latin and a more direct allusion to John 1:29, where John the Baptist points out Jesus to his followers. “Happy” becomes “Blessed” since we can be blessed in happy times or sorrowful ones. This change and the explicit reference to the “Supper of the Lamb” makes clear the allusion to Revelation 19:9. The change from “not worthy to receive you” to “not worthy that you should enter under my roof” makes clearer and more meaningful the Roman centurion’s humble message to Jesus (Matthew 8:8 and Luke 7:6). Finally “my soul” replaces “I” to be more faithful to the Latin and the spiritual impact of receiving Jesus.

At the end of the Mass the priest will say, “The Lord be with you” and the people will respond, “And with your spirit.” There will be new translations for the blessings after Mass but, as before, the people will respond, “Amen.”

For the Dismissal there are new options for the priest or deacon. He may say, “Go forth, the Mass is ended,” or “Go and announce the Gospel of the Lord,” or “Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life,” or simply, “Go in peace.” The people will respond as we do now, “Thanks be to God.”

The changes, because they are different, should cause us to think about and reflect on their meanings to us individually and as church, the body of Christ on earth. While this may initially be awkward, the new language should “point” us towards Christ and renew our spiritual development and deepen our participation in the mystery of the Mass and Eucharist.

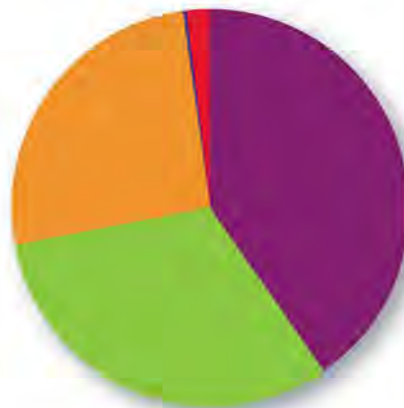
