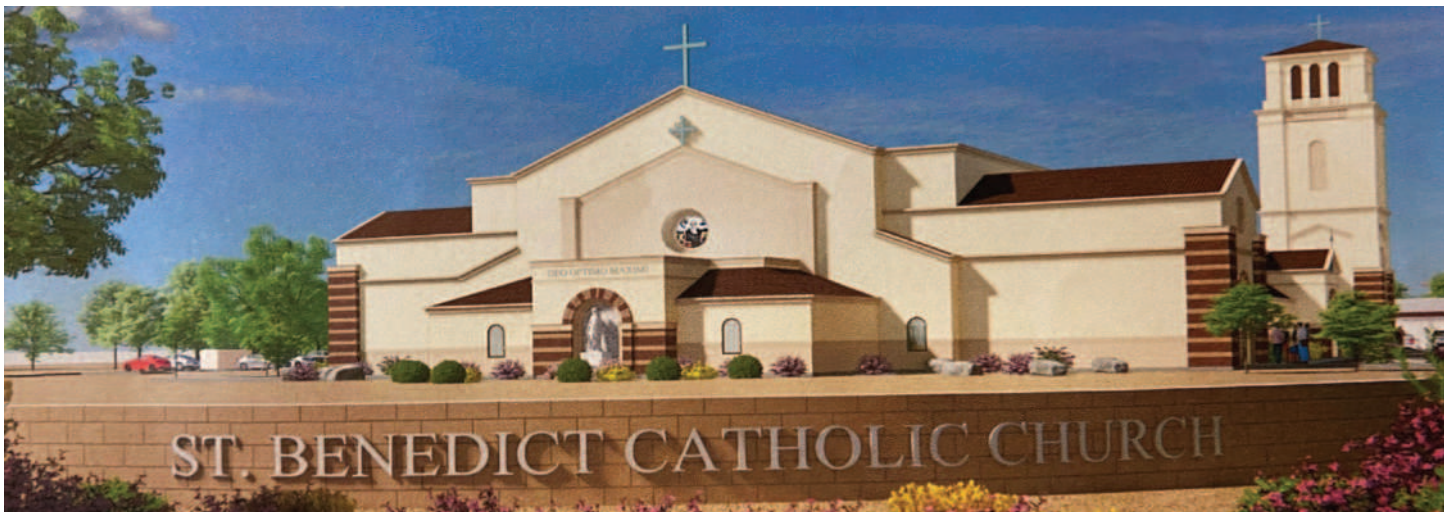

Gospel Reflection

WHERE ARE THE OTHER NINE?



The most meaningful form of gratitude we can offer for the many blessings we have received from God is a willful and generous surrendering of self in alignment with God's will. When we receive a gift from anyone, especially if such a gift is life changing, the natural response is usually to express how grateful we are and how much we value that gift by communicating our thankfulness. This is what we see with Naaman the Syrian (Aramean) general who despite being a foreigner sought and found the prophet Elisha and after an initial hesitation did what the prophet asked him to do and plunged himself into the Jordan seven times to receive a miraculous healing from leprosy. He promptly returned and offered the prophet many gifts as an expression of his profound gratitude but the prophet declined receiving them. Finally, Naaman made a profoundly life transforming request to take loads of soil from Israel to Syria in order to establish the worship of the One True God in his homeland promising to *"no longer offer holocaust or sacrifice to any other god except to the Lord."* This act represented not only his conversion to monotheism but also an acknowledgement of the land of Israel as the Holy Land. Naaman was a type of a Christian, for every Christian goes into the Jordan of the baptismal font in order to emerge cleansed from the contagion of sin. Like Naaman, after baptism, we can plunge ourselves into the Jordan of the sacrament of reconciliation in order to be cleansed from the leprosy of personal sin so we can be restored to righteousness.

We encounter ten lepers like Naaman in the Gospel passage who, cut off from society and from public worship of God could no longer bear the social and spiritual consequences of their condition, broke the rules that kept them away from others, humbled themselves and pleaded for help from Jesus who was passing their way. Unlike some of the miracles performed by Christ, the healing of the lepers did not happen instantly. Jesus guided them through a process that required them to go show themselves to the priests, the custodians of cultic worship in order for the manifestation of the healing they had already received to be made visible. It was in the process of obeying this directive that they received their healing. As demonstrated at the sea of Galilee where Simon and his companions ended up with a huge catch after obeying the directive of Christ to *"cast your nets into the deep,"* the miracle of the healing of the ten lepers strongly suggests that Jesus came to teach us to be obedient to God as an antidote to the tendency to disobey which we acquired through the disobedience of Adam and Eve. It is in obedience that we receive grace which enables us to joyfully enjoy our restored relationship with God. As Christians, we have received several commands to *"go"* by Jesus: *"go and do the same"* (Lk 10: 37) is a command to be merciful to our neighbor like the good Samaritan was. *"Go make disciples of all nations"* (Matt 28:19-20) is a post-resurrection mandate to proselytize Christ. And *"go and sin no more"* (Jn 8:11, Jn 5:14) is a command for a changed life, to stop a sinful lifestyle and commit to an inner conversion once we have received spiritual healing. We should ask ourselves if we are obedient to these mandates.

When they got well, only one of the lepers returned to express gratitude for blessings received by falling at Jesus' feet to thank Him. This leper had no gold and so he offered himself as a token of gratitude. Those who did not return may have had excuses that may have looked reasonable to them like they do to us when we receive blessings from God without expressing gratitude for them. To the one who returned, he was declared saved by Christ to indicate that God bestows even greater blessings when we offer Him the gratitude of the surrendering of our being and life for mercies received.

May we be led by God's Holy Spirit to live in obedience to the loving will of Christ and may our lives be offered a living sacrifice of gratitude to God for His love.

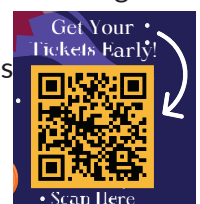
Exciting Community Opportunity!

At that time, Jesus exclaimed, *"I give praise to you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, for although you have hidden these things from the wise and the learned, you have revealed them to the childlike."* (Matthew 11:25)

One of the greatest threats to a pure and childlike faith is intellectual pride. Those who consider themselves as *"wise and learned"* are often tempted to rely upon their own reasoning abilities to come to conclusions and beliefs in their life. We cannot figure out God by ourselves. We need the gift of faith for that, and the gift of faith begins with a spiritual communication from God through which He reveals to us who He is and what is true. Only the childlike, meaning, those who are humble, are able to hear this form of communication from God.

In your life, it is important that you regularly ponder whether you are more like the wise and learned or those who are childlike. Though God is an infinite and incomprehensible mystery, He must be known. And the only way we can come to know God is if He reveals Himself to us. And the only way God will reveal Himself to us is if we remain humble and childlike.

Reflexión sobre las Escrituras

¿DÓNDE ESTÁN LOS OTROS NUEVE?



La forma más significativa de gratitud que podemos ofrecer por las muchas bendiciones que hemos recibido de Dios es una entrega voluntaria y generosa de nosotros mismos en armonía con la voluntad de Dios. Cuando recibimos un regalo de alguien, especialmente si ese regalo nos cambia la vida, la respuesta natural suele ser expresar lo agradecidos que estamos y lo mucho que valoramos ese regalo comunicando nuestro agradecimiento. Esto es lo que vemos en Naamán, el general sirio (araméo) que, a pesar de ser extranjero, buscó y encontró al profeta Eliseo y, tras una vacilación inicial, hizo lo que el profeta le pidió y se sumergió siete veces en el Jordán para recibir una curación milagrosa de la lepra. Regresó rápidamente y ofreció al profeta muchos regalos como expresión de su profunda gratitud, pero el profeta se negó a recibirlos. Finalmente, Naamán hizo una petición que transformó profundamente su vida: llevar tierra de Israel a Siria para establecer el culto al Único Dios Verdadero en su tierra natal, prometiendo «no volver a ofrecer holocaustos ni sacrificios a ningún otro dios excepto al Señor». Este acto representó no solo su conversión al monoteísmo, sino también el reconocimiento de la tierra de Israel como Tierra Santa. Naamán era un tipo de cristiano, ya que todo cristiano se sumerge en el Jordán de la pila bautismal para salir purificado del contagio del pecado. Al igual que Naamán, después del bautismo, podemos sumergirnos en el Jordán del sacramento de la reconciliación para ser purificados de la lepra del pecado personal y así poder recuperar la rectitud.

En el pasaje del Evangelio encontramos a diez leprosos como Naamán que, apartados de la sociedad y del culto público a Dios, ya no podían soportar las consecuencias sociales y espirituales de su condición, rompieron las reglas que los mantenían alejados de los demás, se humillaron y suplicaron ayuda a Jesús, que pasaba por allí. A diferencia de algunos de los milagros realizados por Cristo, la curación de los leprosos no se produjo de forma instantánea. Jesús los guió a través de un proceso que les exigía presentarse ante los sacerdotes, los custodios del culto, para que la manifestación de la curación que ya habían recibido fuera visible. Fue al obedecer esta directiva cuando recibieron su curación. Como se demostró en el mar de Galilea, donde Simón y sus compañeros obtuvieron una gran pesca después de obedecer la orden de Cristo de «echar las redes en lo profundo», el milagro de la curación de los diez leprosos sugiere claramente que Jesús vino a enseñarnos a ser obedientes a Dios como antídoto contra la tendencia a desobedecer que adquirimos a través de la desobediencia de Adán y Eva. Es en la obediencia que recibimos la gracia que nos permite disfrutar con alegría nuestra relación restaurada con Dios. Como cristianos, hemos recibido varios mandamientos de Jesús de «ir»: «ve y haz lo mismo» (Lc 10, 37) es un mandamiento de ser misericordiosos con nuestro prójimo, como lo fue el buen samaritano. «Id y haced discípulos a todas las naciones» (Mateo 28:19-20) es un mandato posterior a la resurrección para evangelizar a Cristo. Y «vete y no peques más» (Juan 8:11, Juan 5:14) es una orden para cambiar de vida, dejar atrás un estilo de vida pecaminoso y comprometerse con una conversión interior una vez que hemos recibido la sanación espiritual. Debemos preguntarnos si somos obedientes a estos mandatos.

Cuando se curaron, solo uno de los leprosos regresó para expresar su gratitud por las bendiciones recibidas, postrándose a los pies de Jesús para darle las gracias. Este leproso no tenía oro, por lo que se ofreció a sí mismo como muestra de gratitud. Los que no regresaron pueden haber tenido excusas que les parecían razonables, al igual que nos pasa a nosotros cuando recibimos bendiciones de Dios sin expresar gratitud por ellas. A aquel que regresó, se le declaró salvado por Cristo para indicar que Dios nos concede bendiciones aún mayores cuando le ofrecemos nuestra gratitud entregándole nuestro ser y nuestra vida por las misericordias recibidas.

Que el Espíritu Santo de Dios nos guíe para vivir en obediencia a la voluntad amorosa de Cristo y que nuestras vidas sean ofrecidas como sacrificio vivo de gratitud a Dios por su amor.
