Gospel Reflection

AS LONG AS MOSES KEPT HIS HANDS RAISED UP, ISRAEL HAD THE BETTER OF THE FIGHT

God has given us inherent capacity to accomplish many things by ourselves. There are also many other things that may be quite difficult if not outrightly impossible for us to accomplish without Divine help. St. Paul held that, "we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places." (Ephesians 6:12). For this reason every Christian stands in need of God's help at all times as we journey towards the final fulfillment of the Kingdom of God in the world to come. The surest way to obtain Divine assistance, as taught by Jesus, is through persistent prayer. We lose nothing when we ask for God's help to accomplish the day to day tasks that we have. Instead, we gain everything when we ask for the help of His Holy Spirit and grace as we confront the daily challenges of life.

As they traveled through the desert towards the land promised them by God, Israel encountered many adversaries who harassed them and refused to grant them safe passage. One such nation was the people of Amalek. Confronted with an adversary that was violently reluctant to let them pass, Israel needed to fight in order to keep any hopes of getting to the promised land alive. Moses, the leader of the people of Israel devised some kind of division of labor, he sent Joshua with Israel's warriors to the front to fight for Israel while he, Aaron and Hur ascended the mountain to intercede for them. Moses did not send the whole of Israel, himself inclusive, to the front. Neither did he ask that all stay in the camp to pray away their adversity, nor did Joshua the youthful warrior object to any part of the battle plans of his mentor Moses.

The way God has designed our being, labor has its place in the scheme of things as does faith and prayer. When a complimentary relationship exists between prayer and work in an individual Christian or even in an ecclessial community, the yielding of good Christian fruits is often a natural consequence.

It is worth noting that in the Old Testament, there were no completely "secular" wars. Each battle was both a physical and spiritual conflict because the opposing armies always called on their respective Gods. The conflict of nations was always a conflict of their divinities and the stronger divinities won. This is why Moses had to have his hands held up in supplication to Israel's God as Joshua and his team fought the physical battle.

As Christians, freed from the slavery to sin and on our way to the promised land, we encounter several challenges. The Exodus experience provides for us a formidable template for confronting them with the intent to triumph over them. Work and prayer is the counsel of Scripture. As individuals, we sometimes find ourselves in situations where we need to battle with an addiction or a relapse to an addiction after a period of freedom. If we work assiduously and pray persistently, God will always provide the grace with which we shall triumph.

Let us pray during this Liturgical celebration, that we may never grow tired of asking our heavenly Father for His Holy Spirit who will make all things possible for us in the name of Jesus our Lord.






In September, our chapter of SVdP helped 98 families with 127 bags of food, and \$11,713 in financial assistance. We are truly blessed!

Reflexión sobre las Escrituras

MIENTRAS MOISÉS MANTUVO SUS MANOS LEVANTADAS, ISRAEL TUVO LA SUPERAICIÓN EN LA BATALLA.

Dios nos ha dado la capacidad inherente para lograr muchas cosas por nosotros mismos. También hay muchas otras cosas que pueden ser bastante difíciles, si no imposibles, de lograr sin la ayuda divina. San Pablo sostenía que «no luchamos contra sangre y carne, sino contra principados, contra potestades, contra los gobernantes de las tinieblas de este mundo, contra la maldad espiritual en las regiones celestes» (Efesios 6:12). Por esta razón, todos los cristianos necesitamos la ayuda de Dios en todo momento mientras avanzamos hacia el cumplimiento final del Reino de Dios en el mundo venidero. La forma más segura de obtener la ayuda divina, tal y como nos enseñó Jesús, es a través de la oración persistente. No perdemos nada cuando pedimos la ayuda de Dios para llevar a cabo las tareas cotidianas que tenemos. Al contrario, lo ganamos todo cuando pedimos la ayuda de Su Espíritu Santo y Su gracia al enfrentarnos a los retos diarios de la vida.

Mientras viajaban por el desierto hacia la tierra que Dios les había prometido, Israel se encontró con muchos adversarios que los acosaban y se negaban a concederles un paso seguro. Una de esas naciones era el pueblo de Amalek. Ante un adversario que se resistía violentamente a dejarlos pasar, Israel tuvo que luchar para mantener viva la esperanza de llegar a la tierra prometida. Moisés, el líder del pueblo de Israel, ideó una especie de división del trabajo: envió a Josué con los guerreros de Israel al frente para luchar por Israel, mientras que él, Aarón y Hur subieron a la montaña para interceder por ellos. Moisés no envió a todo Israel, incluido él mismo, al frente. Tampoco pidió que todos se quedaran en el campamento para rezar por su adversidad, ni Josué, el joven guerrero, se opuso a ninguna parte de los planes de batalla de su mentor Moisés.

Tal y como Dios ha diseñado nuestro ser, el trabajo tiene su lugar en el orden de las cosas, al igual que la fe y la oración. Cuando existe una relación complementaria entre la oración y el trabajo en un cristiano individual o incluso en una comunidad eclesial, el fruto de una buena vida cristiana es a menudo una consecuencia natural.

Cabe señalar que en el Antiguo Testamento no existían guerras completamente «seculares». Cada batalla era un conflicto tanto físico como espiritual, ya que los ejércitos enemigos siempre invocaban a sus respectivos dioses. El conflicto entre naciones siempre fue un conflicto entre sus divinidades, y las divinidades más fuertes ganaban. Por eso Moisés tuvo que mantener las manos levantadas en señal de súplica al Dios de Israel mientras Josué y su equipo libraban la batalla física.

Como cristianos, liberados de la esclavitud del pecado y en camino hacia la tierra prometida, nos encontramos con varios desafíos. La experiencia del Éxodo nos proporciona un modelo formidable para enfrentarlos con la intención de triunfar sobre ellos. El trabajo y la oración son el consejo de las Escrituras. Como individuos, a veces nos encontramos en situaciones en las que tenemos que luchar contra una adicción o una recaída en una adicción tras un periodo de libertad. Si trabajamos con ahínco y rezamos con perseverancia, Dios siempre nos proporcionará la gracia con la que triunfaremos.

Oremos durante esta celebración litúrgica para que nunca nos cansemos de pedirle a nuestro Padre celestial su Espíritu Santo, que hará que todo sea posible para nosotros en el nombre de Jesús, nuestro Señor.

Por favor, sea amable y que Dios le bendiga.
