Gospel Reflection

GAUDETE IN DOMINO SEMPER (REJOICE IN THE LORD ALWAYS)



The Entrance Antiphon from which this weekend derives its liturgical name (Gaudete Sunday) invites us repeatedly to rejoice because our salvation is near. Those who wait for the coming of the Savior are exhorted neither to despair nor resort to complacency, for the Savior will arrive soon. Waiting can be at a time when things seem to be getting worse, is sometimes not pleasant, and can cause the faltering of best intentions. This unfortunate scenario was experienced by John the Baptist who had the singular privilege of being the precursor to the coming Messiah.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church described John the Baptist as “..... the Lord’s immediate precursor or forerunner, sent to prepare His way. Prophet of the Most High, John surpasses all the prophets of whom he is the last. He inaugurates the Gospel, already from his mother’s womb welcoming the coming of Christ and rejoices in being the friend of the bridegroom, whom he points out as the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world. Going before Jesus in the Spirit of Elijah, John bears witness to Christ in his preaching, by his baptism of conversion, and through his martyrdom.” (CCC 523). Yet, when confronted with unjust incarceration and imminent death, John sent messengers to Jesus to ascertain with clarity if Jesus was the Christ. Faith in Jesus Christ is easy to profess when life is easy and neat, the real test comes when one experiences a consistent strain of difficult moments. Moments of grief, the loss of loved ones, career turbulence, marital and family uncertainties, financial crunch, and periods when one is a witness to the evils of famine, war and general societal decadence could become moments when one’s faith could be tried like John’s. Dark nights and trials of faith can happen to anyone, even saints have gone through them. Such experiences are not incompatible with holiness, instead, one who is aided by grace to triumph over them gains stronger faith and trust in Jesus Christ.

Jesus’ response to John through the emissaries he sent is quite instructive. He didn’t say to tell John “of course I am Christ.” Instead, He asked them to present to John evidence of the work of salvation which they themselves were witnesses to, works that were consistent with what the prophets before John had foretold would be done by the Messiah. Our preaching of the Gospel is best done through practical witnessing, Christ’s standard measurement of faith is the fruits which are most visible in charity and compassion.

While we rejoice as our salvation draws nearer, we must also hasten to be more than prophets, Children of God who are redeemed by the blood of the Lamb, not reeds swayed by the wind of life but firm in faith in the Lord Jesus knowing that all things work towards good for those who love God.

May God grant us faith that will neither wane nor falter, may our witness to the Gospel bear fruits that last and may we find and share with others true joy and peace at Christmas.

"I pray also that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened in order that you may know the hope to which he has called you, the riches of his glorious inheritance in the Saints, and his incomparably great power for us who believe"

(Eph 1:18-19)

Paul's letter to the Ephesians exhorts believers to experience three important things in their spiritual lives that he experienced personally.

First, God wants you to have the eyes of your heart enlightened in order to know the hope to which He has called you. God has called each of us to a future and a hope. Paul prays they will experience this.

Second, God wants you to know there is an inheritance for each believer in Jesus Christ. There are riches to be had, not financial, but spiritual riches that are laid up for every saint. As you are faithful to His calling in your life, there will be a reward for your faithfulness.

Third, God desires that you tap into the power that is available to every believer. Paul often exhorted believers not to look at his pervasive words, but the demonstration of the power of God in his life. He wants you to know the same power is available to you. After all, Jesus said we would do even greater works than He did after He sent the Holy Spirit to us.

Pray that God reveals the hope that exists inside of you, be encouraged that there is an inheritance waiting for you, and know that you have power that resides in you that awaits those who exercise their faith to release it.

Reflexión sobre las Escrituras



GAUDETE IN DOMINO SEMPER (ALÉGRATE SIEMPRE EN EL SEÑOR)



La antífona de entrada, de la que deriva el nombre litúrgico de este fin de semana (Domingo Gaudete), nos invita repetidamente a regocijarnos porque nuestra salvación está cerca. Se exhorta a quienes esperan la llegada del Salvador a no desesperarse ni caer en la complacencia, pues el Salvador llegará pronto. La espera puede producirse en un momento en el que las cosas parecen empeorar, a veces no es agradable y puede hacer que se tambaleen las mejores intenciones. Este desafortunado escenario lo vivió Juan el Bautista, que tuvo el privilegio singular de ser el precursor del Mesías venidero.

El Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica describió a Juan el Bautista como «... el precursor o precursor inmediato del Señor, enviado para preparar su camino. Profeta del Altísimo, Juan supera a todos los profetas, de los que él es el último. Inaugura el Evangelio, ya desde el seno de su madre, acogiendo la venida de Cristo y se regocija por ser el amigo del novio, a quien señala como el Cordero de Dios, que quita el pecado del mundo. Precediendo a Jesús en el espíritu de Elías, Juan da testimonio de Cristo en su predicación, con su bautismo de conversión y con su martirio». (CCC 523). Sin embargo, cuando se enfrentó a un encarcelamiento injusto y a una muerte inminente, Juan envió mensajeros a Jesús para asegurarse con claridad de que Jesús era el Cristo. Es fácil profesar la fe en Jesucristo cuando la vida es fácil y ordenada, pero la verdadera prueba llega cuando uno experimenta una serie constante de momentos difíciles. Los momentos de dolor, la pérdida de seres queridos, las turbulencias profesionales, las incertidumbres matrimoniales y familiares, las crisis financieras y los períodos en los que uno es testigo de los males del hambre, la guerra y la decadencia social generalizada pueden convertirse en momentos en los que la fe de uno puede ser puesta a prueba, como le sucedió a Juan. Las noches oscuras y las pruebas de fe pueden ocurrirle a cualquiera, incluso los santos las han atravesado. Tales experiencias no son incompatibles con la santidad, sino que, por el contrario, quien recibe la ayuda de la gracia para superarlas obtiene una fe y una confianza más fuertes en Jesucristo.

La respuesta de Jesús a Juan a través de los emisarios que envió es muy instructiva. No les dijo que le dijeran a Juan «por supuesto que soy el Cristo». En cambio, les pidió que le presentaran a Juan pruebas de la obra de salvación de la que ellos mismos eran testigos, obras que eran coherentes con lo que los profetas anteriores a Juan habían predicho que haría el Mesías. La mejor manera de predicar el Evangelio es mediante el testimonio práctico. La medida estándar de la fe según Cristo son los frutos, que se manifiestan sobre todo en la caridad y la compasión.

Mientras nos regocijamos al ver que nuestra salvación se acerca, también debemos apresurarnos a ser más que profetas, hijos de Dios redimidos por la sangre del Cordero, no cañas que se mecen con el viento de la vida, sino firmes en la fe en el Señor Jesús, sabiendo que todas las cosas cooperan para el bien de aquellos que aman a Dios.

Que Dios nos conceda una fe que no decaiga ni vacile, que nuestro testimonio del Evangelio dé frutos duraderos y que encontremos y compartamos con los demás la verdadera alegría y paz en Navidad.


