Gospel Reflection

THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

The Epiphany of the Lord is traditionally celebrated on January 6, but here in the United States it is moved to the First Sunday of the New Year as it is done in other countries. In the Feast of the Epiphany, we celebrate Jesus revealing Himself, not as a mere "King of the Jews," but as Savior of the whole world. This is the story of the Magi, noble men who saw His sign and traveled from the east to arrive at His birth place in order to worship Him. They followed a visible sign to find reality itself, God made visible in the baby Jesus, in the most unlikely of places for royalty and Divinity: in Bethlehem of Judea, housed in a manger among shepherds and their flock and dwelling among men with quiet peace. They found the Son of God, the second person in the Most Holy Trinity, who had entered the history of humanity from within in the arms of His virgin mother and guarded by His foster father.

The Magi's journey from the Oriental lands to an encounter with Divinity in Bethlehem mirrors our own individual and sometimes communal journey of faith. God led them through a sign towards Christ. God continues to call us to an encounter that ultimately leads to a righteous relationship with Him through signs. We see the beauty and the order of things that point to a benevolent creator and a loving Father. We receive the sacraments that confer grace, providing a sweet foretaste of life with God in eternity. We see love and unity, fruits the Church bears, and we can imagine full fellowship with Christ in Heaven.

But the wise men faltered a little. When they arrived in Jerusalem, instead of resolutely following the guidance provided by God for them to find Christ, they resorted to seeking counsel within the darkness, literally abandoning the light of the star which did not stop as they entered Jerusalem. On our way to Heaven, God provides scripture and the sacraments to guide us on the right path. Sometimes we seek the counsel of the "Herods of our time" who are most happy and ready to lead us astray. We are often lured away from truth by fear, greed, pride and the desire to be accepted by the world. There are wise men and women in our time who take social media too seriously and make very important and life-transforming decisions straight from what is trending on social media. By turning to this "Herod," we put our salvation at risk as the Magi placed the safety of the Baby Jesus at risk.

No one can outdo God in providing us with second, and more, chances. When the Magi faltered, God redirected them. When they left Herod's presence with a promise to report to him the exact location of the Newborn King, they found the star still waiting to lead them to the Nativity site. After offering gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh (again revealing His Kingship, priesthood and foretelling that He would die in order that we may live) they listened to God's warning in a dream and returned home through a way that did not lead to Herod. It is never too late to make amends by turning away from evil or participation in it in order to return home.

May God continue to reveal Himself to us through His Son, Jesus Christ. May He keep us focussed on the truth so that the distractions of this world do not lead us to drift away from His love. And may we never be ashamed to return to His loving embrace if we have strayed away from our loving Father.

A Family House Blessing Activity for the New Year

The New Year is the perfect time to gather your family together to ask God's blessing on your home and protection for all who live and visit within it. It is an invitation for Jesus to remain at the center of every home.

The Blessing can be done simply by using chalk to write over the door:

20 + C + M + B + 26

(The 20 + 26 represents the year and the C, M, B are twofold: They are the first initials of the three Magi, but also initials for the Latin blessing, *Christus mansionem benedicat*, meaning "Christ bless this house.")

Finally, offer the following prayer:

Oh blessed Lord, visit this home with the gladness of your presence.

*Bless all who live or visit here with the gift of your love; and grant
that we may manifest your love to each other and to all whose lives we touch.
May we grow in grace and in the knowledge and love of you. Guide, comfort
and strengthen us in peace, Oh Jesus Christ, now and forever. Amen.*

"Likewise, no one pours new wine into old wine skins. Otherwise, the new wine will burst the skins, and it will be spilled, and the skins will be ruined. Rather, new wine must be poured into fresh wine skins. And no one who has been drinking old wine, desires new, for he says "the old is good." (Luke 5:37-39)

The short parable comes at the beginning of Jesus' public ministry. He just called Levi, the tax collector, to become one of his disciples, and then Levi invited Jesus to dine at his home with other tax collectors and sinners. When the scribes and Pharisees saw this, they objected and challenged our Lord. In response, Jesus tells this parable as a way of explaining that He came to call everyone to change and to experience a new transformation of their life.

The "new wine" spoken of is the grace poured forth from the Cross. Remember the blood and water that sprung forth from His side as He hung upon the Cross.

Many of the church Fathers pointed out that the old wine that many prefer is a reference to those who wanted to continue living according to the old law. This was especially true of the scribes and Pharisees, to whom Jesus was speaking in this parable.

If we are to receive this new line of the grace of God, we must be ready and willing to abandon our old selves and become new.

How do you deal with change in life? If you want to grow in holiness, you can be certain that change is the only constant in life. We must become new creations, each and every day, growing, being more transformed, changing always, giving up the old and embracing that which is ever new.

Reflect today, upon the courage it takes to change. What is it in your life that you may be afraid to change? What old wine do you prefer over the new wine of God's grace?

FAQ: Why Should I Register at Saint Benedict Catholic Church?

1. A sense of belonging and identity within the parish community.
2. It is a commitment to practice your faith.
3. Registration enables the parish pastor and staff to get to know you better, to welcome you and to minister to you, in good times and in bad.
4. Registration helps you stay connected with your parish and helps your parish stay connected with you. Also, if you use offertory envelopes or online giving, you will have a statement for income tax purposes.
5. Registered, active members are eligible to be sacramental sponsors and Godparents.
6. Census numbers may determine how many priests are assigned to a parish and how many Masses and enrichment programs are planned and scheduled.
7. Children are considered members with their parents until they turn 18 years old. Once they are 18, it is their responsibility to join a church family, participate in the Mass and register as a member independent of their parents.

Registration forms can be also be found in the parish Narthex in back of the church. Submit your completed form to the parish office, drop it in the collection basket or the office drop box located outside the office window.

Reflexión sobre las Escrituras

LA EPIFANÍA DEL SEÑOR

La Epifanía del Señor se celebra tradicionalmente el 6 de enero, pero aquí en Estados Unidos se traslada al primer domingo del año nuevo, al igual que en otros países. En la fiesta de la Epifanía, celebramos que Jesús se reveló a sí mismo, no como un simple «Rey de los judíos», sino como Salvador del mundo entero. Esta es la historia de los Reyes Magos, hombres nobles que vieron su señal y viajaron desde Oriente hasta su lugar de nacimiento para adorarlo. Siguieron una señal visible para encontrar la realidad misma, Dios hecho visible en el niño Jesús, en el lugar más improbable para la realeza y la divinidad: en Belén de Judea, alojado en un pesebre entre pastores y su rebaño y viviendo entre los hombres con tranquila paz. Encontraron al Hijo de Dios, la segunda persona de la Santísima Trinidad, que había entrado en la historia de la humanidad desde dentro, en brazos de su madre virgen y protegido por su padre adoptivo.



El viaje de los Reyes Magos desde las tierras orientales hasta su encuentro con la Divinidad en Belén refleja nuestro propio viaje de fe, tanto individual como, en ocasiones, comunitario. Dios los guió a través de una señal hacia Cristo. Dios sigue llamándonos a un encuentro que, en última instancia, nos lleva a una relación justa con Él a través de señales. Vemos la belleza y el orden de las cosas que apuntan a un creador benevolente y a un Padre amoroso. Recibimos los sacramentos que nos confieren la gracia, proporcionándonos un dulce anticipo de la vida con Dios en la eternidad. Vemos el amor y la unidad, frutos que da la Iglesia, y podemos imaginar la plena comunión con Cristo en el Cielo.

Pero los sabios vacilaron un poco. Cuando llegaron a Jerusalén, en lugar de seguir con determinación la guía que Dios les había dado para encontrar a Cristo, recurrieron a buscar consejo en la oscuridad, abandonando literalmente la luz de la estrella, que no se detuvo cuando entraron en Jerusalén. En nuestro camino hacia el cielo, Dios nos proporciona las Escrituras y los sacramentos para guiarnos por el camino correcto. A veces buscamos el consejo de los «Herodes de nuestro tiempo», que están encantados y dispuestos a desviarnos del camino. A menudo nos alejamos de la verdad por miedo, codicia, orgullo y el deseo de ser aceptados por el mundo. Hay hombres y mujeres sabios en nuestro tiempo que se toman las redes sociales demasiado en serio y toman decisiones muy importantes y que transforman sus vidas basándose directamente en lo que es tendencia en las redes sociales. Al recurrir a este «Herodes», ponemos en peligro nuestra salvación, al igual que los Reyes Magos pusieron en peligro la seguridad del Niño Jesús.

Nadie puede superar a Dios a la hora de darnos segundas oportunidades, y más. Cuando los Reyes Magos vacilaron, Dios los redirigió. Cuando abandonaron la presencia de Herodes con la promesa de informarle de la ubicación exacta del Rey recién nacido, encontraron que la estrella seguía esperándolos para guiarlos hasta el lugar del nacimiento. Después de ofrecer regalos de oro, incienso y mirra (revelando una vez más su realeza, su sacerdocio y presagiando que moriría para que nosotros pudiéramos vivir), escucharon la advertencia de Dios en un sueño y regresaron a casa por un camino que no conducía a Herodes. Nunca es demasiado tarde para enmendarse alejándose del mal o de la participación en él para poder regresar a casa.

Que Dios continúe revelándose a nosotros a través de Su Hijo, Jesucristo. Que Él nos mantenga enfocados en la verdad para que las distracciones de este mundo no nos alejen de Su amor. Y que nunca nos avergonzemos de volver a Su amoroso abrazo si nos hemos alejado de nuestro amoroso Padre.


