Gospel Reflection

THE SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY TRINITY



Dear Friends in Christ,

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. The Trinity invites us into the deepest mystery of the Christian faith: one God in three Divine Persons - the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. The Trinity is a communion of love into which every Christian is called to enter. The readings of today reveal a God who is merciful, relational, loving, and united in perfect harmony.

In the first reading from Exodus 34:4-6, 8-9, Moses encounters God on Mount Sinai after the people of Israel had sinned by worshipping the golden calf. God reveals Himself not primarily through power or punishment, but through mercy and compassion: This revelation is deeply Trinitarian because it shows the very heart of God. The Father is loving, the Son becomes the visible face of that mercy, and the Holy Spirit pours that love into human hearts. Moses bows in worship because true encounter with God always leads to humility and surrender. It shows that God desires relationship and communion with His people.

The second reading from 2 Corinthians 13:11-13 beautifully expresses how the Trinity shapes Christian life and community. St. Paul says, "The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all." This is one of the clearest Trinitarian blessings in Scripture. Paul connects the grace of Christ, the love of the Father, and the communion of the Holy Spirit as the foundation of Christian existence. Christians are therefore called not merely to believe in the Trinity intellectually, but to live the life of the Trinity practically through unity, peace, reconciliation, and mutual love.

The Gospel of John 3:16-18 gives us perhaps the clearest summary of the mystery of the Trinity and the mission of salvation: "For God so loved the world that He gave his only Son." Here we see the Father loving humanity so deeply that He sends His Son into the world, not to condemn it, but to save it. The Son freely offers Himself for the salvation of mankind, while the Holy Spirit continues the work of grace in the hearts of believers. The Trinity therefore is a communion of self-giving love. The unity of the Trinity is extremely important for Christians because it becomes the model for human relationships and Christian community. The Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are distinct Persons, yet perfectly united in love and purpose. There is no division, jealousy, competition, or selfishness within God. This teaches Christians that true unity does not destroy individuality but perfects it through love. In a world marked by division, hatred, tribalism, violence, and selfishness, the Trinity calls us to become people of communion, forgiveness, collaboration, and peace.

As Christians, we are called to emulate several virtues of the Trinity: unity in diversity, selfless love, mutual respect, communion and fellowship, humility and obedience, mercy and compassion. Families, communities, and the Church itself are meant to reflect the life of the Trinity. Every act of forgiveness, charity, reconciliation, and sacrificial love becomes a reflection of the inner life of God.

Augustine of Hippo wrote extensively on the Trinity in his famous work *De Trinitate* ("On the Trinity"). He explained that the Trinity is a mystery of perfect love and compared it to the human faculties of memory, understanding, and will, which exist distinctly yet remain one. Similarly, Thomas Aquinas taught that the Trinity reveals the fullness of divine love and relationship. He emphasized that human beings, created in the image of God, are called to participate in this divine communion through holiness, charity, and grace. We are created by the Father, redeemed by the Son, and sanctified by the Holy Spirit. Every time we make the Sign of the Cross, we proclaim this mystery and place our lives under the communion of the Triune God. Therefore, the Feast of the Most Holy Trinity calls every Christian to move beyond division and selfishness into deeper love, unity, holiness, and communion. As the Trinity lives in perfect harmony, so too must the Church, families, and society strive to live in peace and mutual love. May the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit remain with us always. Amen.

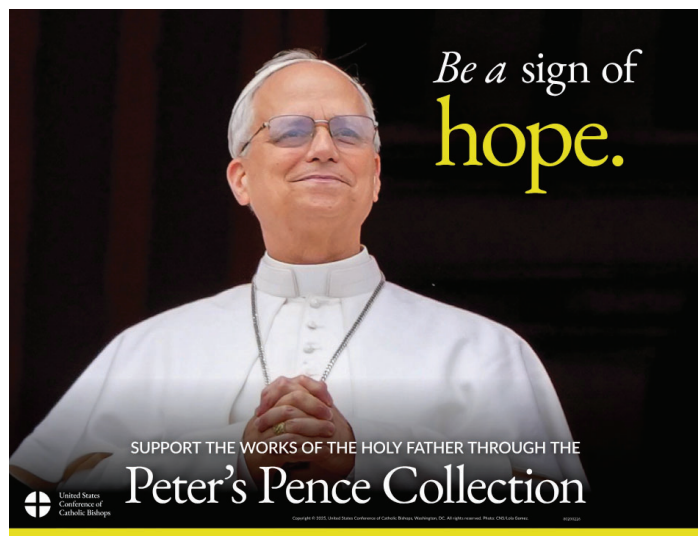

Reflexión sobre las Escrituras

SOLEMNIDAD DE LA SANTÍSIMA TRINIDAD



Queridos amigos en Cristo,

Hoy celebramos la solemnidad de la Santísima Trinidad. La Trinidad nos invita a adentrarnos en el misterio más profundo de la fe cristiana: un solo Dios en tres Personas divinas: el Padre, el Hijo y el Espíritu Santo. La Trinidad es una comunión de amor a la que todo cristiano está llamado a pertenecer. Las lecturas de hoy nos revelan a un Dios misericordioso, cercano, amoroso y unido en perfecta armonía.

En la primera lectura, tomada de Éxodo 34, 4-6. 8-9, Moisés se encuentra con Dios en el monte Sinaí después de que el pueblo de Israel pecara al adorar al becerro de oro. Dios se revela no principalmente a través del poder o el castigo, sino a través de la misericordia y la compasión: esta revelación es profundamente trinitaria porque muestra el corazón mismo de Dios. El Padre es amor, el Hijo se convierte en el rostro visible de esa misericordia, y el Espíritu Santo derrama ese amor en los corazones humanos. Moisés se inclina en adoración porque el verdadero encuentro con Dios siempre conduce a la humildad y la entrega. Esto muestra que Dios desea una relación y comunión con su pueblo.

La segunda lectura, tomada de 2 Corintios 13, 11-13, expresa de manera hermosa cómo la Trinidad da forma a la vida y la comunidad cristianas. San Pablo dice: «Que la gracia del Señor Jesucristo, el amor de Dios y la comunión del Espíritu Santo estén con todos vosotros». Esta es una de las bendiciones trinitarias más claras de las Escrituras. Pablo vincula la gracia de Cristo, el amor del Padre y la comunión del Espíritu Santo como fundamento de la existencia cristiana. Por lo tanto, los cristianos están llamados no solo a creer en la Trinidad intelectualmente, sino a vivir la vida de la Trinidad de manera práctica a través de la unidad, la paz, la reconciliación y el amor mutuo.

El Evangelio de Juan 3:16-18 nos ofrece quizá el resumen más claro del misterio de la Trinidad y de la misión de la salvación: «Porque tanto amó Dios al mundo, que dio a su Hijo único». Aquí vemos al Padre amar a la humanidad tan profundamente que envía a su Hijo al mundo, no para condenarlo, sino para salvarlo. El Hijo se ofrece libremente a sí mismo por la salvación de la humanidad, mientras que el Espíritu Santo continúa la obra de la gracia en los corazones de los creyentes. La Trinidad es, por lo tanto, una comunión de amor abnegado. La unidad de la Trinidad es sumamente importante para los cristianos, ya que se convierte en el modelo para las relaciones humanas y la comunidad cristiana. El Padre, el Hijo y el Espíritu Santo son Personas distintas, pero perfectamente unidas en el amor y en el propósito. No hay división, envidia, rivalidad ni egoísmo en Dios. Esto enseña a los cristianos que la verdadera unidad no destruye la individualidad, sino que la perfecciona a través del amor. En un mundo marcado por la división, el odio, el tribalismo, la violencia y el egoísmo, la Trinidad nos llama a convertirnos en personas de comunión, perdón, colaboración y paz.

Como cristianos, estamos llamados a imitar varias virtudes de la Trinidad: la unidad en la diversidad, el amor desinteresado, el respeto mutuo, la comunión y la fraternidad, la humildad y la obediencia, la misericordia y la compasión. Las familias, las comunidades y la propia Iglesia están llamadas a reflejar la vida de la Trinidad. Cada acto de perdón, caridad, reconciliación y amor abnegado se convierte en un reflejo de la vida interior de Dios.

Agustín de Hipona escribió extensamente sobre la Trinidad en su famosa obra **De Trinitate** («Sobre la Trinidad»). Explicó que la Trinidad es un misterio de amor perfecto y la comparó con las facultades humanas de la memoria, el entendimiento y la voluntad, que existen de forma distinta pero siguen siendo una sola. De manera similar, Tomás de Aquino enseñó que la Trinidad revela la plenitud del amor y la relación divinos. Hizo hincapié en que los seres humanos, creados a imagen de Dios, están llamados a participar en esta comunión divina a través de la santidad, la caridad y la gracia. Hemos sido creados por el Padre, redimidos por el Hijo y santificados por el Espíritu Santo. Cada vez que hacemos la señal de la cruz, proclamamos este misterio y ponemos nuestras vidas bajo la comunión del Dios Trino. Por lo tanto, la fiesta de la Santísima Trinidad llama a todo cristiano a superar la división y el egoísmo para alcanzar un amor, una unidad, una santidad y una comunión más profundos. Así como la Trinidad vive en perfecta armonía, también la Iglesia, las familias y la sociedad deben esforzarse por vivir en paz y amor mutuo. Que la gracia de nuestro Señor Jesucristo, el amor de Dios y la comunión del Espíritu Santo permanezcan siempre con nosotros. Amén.

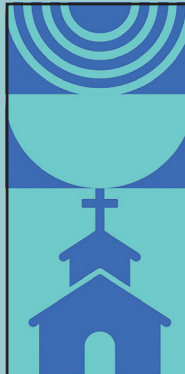
