Gospel Reflection

LOVE, HOSPITALITY AND REDEMPTION



My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Today's readings invite us to reflect on the cost of discipleship, the power of hospitality, and the new life we have received in Christ. At the heart of all three readings is a simple but challenging truth: when we place God first in our lives, He transforms our ordinary acts of faithfulness into channels of grace and blessing.

In the first reading, we encounter the Shunammite woman, a person of remarkable generosity and spiritual sensitivity. She recognized Elisha as a man of God and welcomed him into her home. She did not offer hospitality because she expected a reward, she simply desired to honor God through His servant. Yet God saw her hidden generosity and blessed her with the gift of a son, despite her years of childlessness. This reminds us that God notices the sacrifices, kindness, and acts of love that often go unseen by others. No act of generosity done for God's sake is ever forgotten.

In the second reading, Saint Paul reminds us that through baptism we have died and risen with Christ. We are no longer slaves to sin, fear, selfishness or hopelessness. We have been given a new identity. The Christian life is not simply about becoming a better person; it is about participating in the very life of Christ. Every day we are called to die to whatever separates us from God and to rise to a new way of living marked by faith, hope, love, and holiness.

In the Gospel, Jesus presents what may be one of His most demanding teachings: *"Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me."* Jesus is not asking us to love our families less; rather, He is calling us to love Him first. Every other love in our lives must flow from our relationship with Him. When Christ occupies the centre of our hearts, we become better spouses, parents, children, friends, and disciples. But when anything takes the place of God, our lives lose their proper direction.

Jesus goes even further by saying that whoever does not take up his cross and follow Him is not worthy of Him. Discipleship is not merely about comfort, success, or receiving blessings. It involves sacrifice, perseverance and fidelity even when the path is difficult. The cross may come in the form of sickness, disappointment, family struggles, ministry challenges, loneliness, or personal weaknesses. Yet Jesus assures us that whoever loses his life for His sake will find it. The paradox of the Gospel is that true life is discovered not in self-preservation but in self-giving love.

The connection between the three readings is profound. The Shunammite woman welcomed God's servant and received life. The baptized Christian welcomes Christ and receives new life. The disciple who welcomes others in Christ's name participates in God's saving work. Jesus tells us that anyone who gives a cup of cold water to one of His little ones will not go unrewarded. In God's Kingdom, no act of love is insignificant. Every gesture of kindness, every word of encouragement, every sacrifice made for another becomes an offering pleasing to God.

Saint Teresa of Calcutta beautifully reminds us: *"Not all of us can do great things, but we can do small things with great love."*

The Gospel today is a call to precisely this kind of love, a love that places Christ first, embraces sacrifice, welcomes others generously, and serves without seeking recognition. The world often measures greatness by power, wealth, and success. Christ measures greatness by love, fidelity, and self-giving service. Let us ask ourselves: Do I really love God from the depth of my heart? What cross am I being called to carry? How can I show greater hospitality, compassion, and generosity to those in need? May the Lord give us the courage to place Him above all else, the strength to carry our crosses faithfully, and the generosity to welcome Him in every person we meet. Amen.

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament

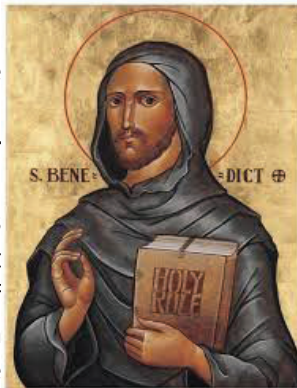

Is your child or teen in need of sacraments?

In the Diocese of Phoenix, baptized children in 2nd grade and above prepare for, and receive, the Sacrament of First Reconciliation. Baptized children in 3rd grade and above prepare for, and receive, both the Sacraments of Confirmation and First Communion.

Our parish follows a family-centered model for sacrament preparation, allowing parents to grow in their faith and understanding of sacraments together with their child.

Children must have completed one year of religious education before beginning sacrament preparation. Registration for both begins on Wednesday, July 1 on the parish website.

FAQ: Why Should I Register at Saint Benedict Catholic Church?

1. A sense of belonging and identity within the parish community.
2. It is a commitment to practice your faith.
3. Registration enables the parish pastor and staff to get to know you better, to welcome you and to minister to you, in good times and in bad.
4. Registration helps you stay connected with your parish and helps your parish stay connected with you. Also, if you use offertory envelopes or online giving, you will have a statement for income tax purposes.
5. Registered, active members are eligible to be sacramental sponsors and Godparents.
6. Census numbers may determine how many priests are assigned to a parish and how many Masses and enrichment programs are planned and scheduled.
7. Children are considered members with their parents until they turn 18 years old. Once they are 18, it is their responsibility to join a church family, participate in the Mass and register as a member independent of their parents.

Reflexión sobre las Escrituras

AMOR, HOSPITALIDAD Y REDENCIÓN



Mis queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo,

Las lecturas de hoy nos invitan a reflexionar sobre el precio del discipulado, el poder de la hospitalidad y la nueva vida que hemos recibido en Cristo. En el centro de estas tres lecturas se encuentra una verdad sencilla, pero que nos plantea un reto: cuando ponemos a Dios en primer lugar en nuestras vidas, Él transforma nuestros actos cotidianos de fidelidad en canales de gracia y bendición.

En la primera lectura, nos encontramos con la mujer de Sunem, una persona de notable generosidad y sensibilidad espiritual. Ella reconoció a Eliseo como un hombre de Dios y lo acogió en su casa. No le ofreció hospitalidad porque esperara una recompensa, sino que simplemente deseaba honrar a Dios a través de su siervo. Sin embargo, Dios vio su generosidad oculta y la bendijo con el don de un hijo, a pesar de que llevaba años sin poder tener descendencia. Esto nos recuerda que Dios se fija en los sacrificios, la bondad y los actos de amor que a menudo pasan desapercibidos para los demás. Ningún acto de generosidad realizado por amor a Dios queda jamás en el olvido.

En la segunda lectura, san Pablo nos recuerda que, a través del bautismo, hemos muerto y resucitado con Cristo. Ya no somos esclavos del pecado, del miedo, del egoísmo ni de la desesperanza. Se nos ha concedido una nueva identidad. La vida cristiana no consiste simplemente en convertirnos en mejores personas, sino en participar de la vida misma de Cristo. Cada día estamos llamados a morir a todo aquello que nos separa de Dios y a resucitar a una nueva forma de vida marcada por la fe, la esperanza, el amor y la santidad.

En el Evangelio, Jesús nos presenta la que quizá sea una de sus enseñanzas más exigentes: «El que ama a su padre o a su madre más que a mí, no es digno de mí». Jesús no nos pide que amemos menos a nuestras familias; más bien, nos llama a amarle a Él por encima de todo. Cualquier otro amor en nuestras vidas debe brotar de nuestra relación con Él. Cuando Cristo ocupa el centro de nuestros corazones, nos convertimos en mejores cónyuges, padres, hijos, amigos y discípulos. Pero cuando algo ocupa el lugar de Dios, nuestras vidas pierden su rumbo.

Jesús va aún más allá al decir que quien no tome su cruz y le siga no es digno de Él. Ser discípulo no consiste únicamente en la comodidad, el éxito o recibir bendiciones. Implica sacrificio, perseverancia y fidelidad, incluso cuando el camino es difícil. La cruz puede manifestarse en forma de enfermedad, decepción, conflictos familiares, dificultades en el ministerio, soledad o debilidades personales. Sin embargo, Jesús nos asegura que quien pierda su vida por su causa, la encontrará. La paradoja del Evangelio es que la verdadera vida no se descubre en la autopreservación, sino en el amor abnegado.

La conexión entre las tres lecturas es profunda. La mujer de Sunem acogió al siervo de Dios y recibió la vida. El cristiano bautizado acoge a Cristo y recibe una nueva vida. El discípulo que acoge a los demás en nombre de Cristo participa en la obra salvadora de Dios. Jesús nos dice que quien dé un vaso de agua fría a uno de sus pequeños no quedará sin recompensa. En el Reino de Dios, ningún acto de amor es insignificante. Cada gesto de bondad, cada palabra de ánimo, cada sacrificio hecho por el prójimo se convierte en una ofrenda agradable a Dios.

Santa Teresa de Calcuta nos lo recuerda de forma maravillosa: «No todos podemos hacer grandes cosas, pero podemos hacer pequeñas cosas con gran amor».

El Evangelio de hoy es una llamada precisamente a este tipo de amor, un amor que antepone a Cristo, que acepta el sacrificio, que acoge a los demás con generosidad y que sirve sin buscar reconocimiento. El mundo suele medir la grandeza por el poder, la riqueza y el éxito. Cristo mide la grandeza por el amor, la fidelidad y el servicio desinteresado. Preguntémosnos: ¿Amo realmente a Dios desde lo más profundo de mi corazón? ¿Qué cruz estoy llamado a llevar? ¿Cómo puedo mostrar mayor hospitalidad, compasión y generosidad hacia los necesitados? Que el Señor nos dé el valor para ponerlo a Él por encima de todo, la fuerza para llevar nuestras cruces con fidelidad y la generosidad para acogerlo en cada persona con la que nos encontramos. Amén.

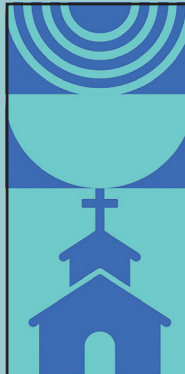
