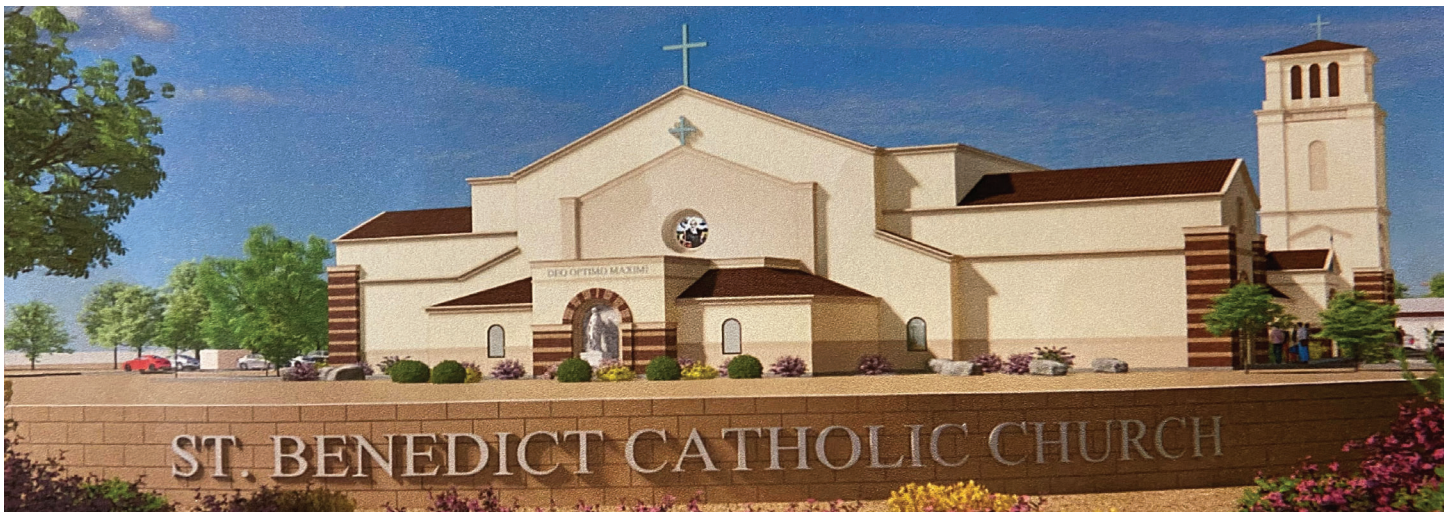

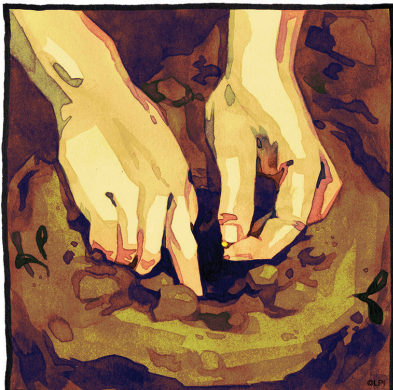

Gospel Reflection

"GOD'S PATIENCE GIVES US TIME TO CHANGE"



My Dear Brothers and Sisters In Christ,

Life often presents us with people and situations that test our patience. We wonder why evil seems to flourish while the good struggle. We ask why God appears to delay His judgment. Today's readings answer these questions with one beautiful message: God is just, but He is also infinitely patient and merciful. His patience is not weakness; it is love giving sinners the opportunity to repent.

The first reading from the Book of Wisdom tells us that God is the only true Judge, and because He is all-powerful, He chooses mercy rather than harshness. *"You gave your children good ground for hope that you would permit repentance for their sins."* God's strength is shown not by destroying sinners immediately but by giving them time to return to Him.

In the Gospel, Jesus tells the parable of the wheat and the weeds. The servants want to uproot the weeds immediately, but the master says, *"Let both grow together until the harvest."* This teaches us that only God sees the human heart. What looks like a weed today may become fruitful wheat tomorrow. God patiently waits because He desires conversion, not destruction.

Many of us have made mistakes in life. If God had judged us immediately after our sins, where would we be today? His patience has allowed us to grow, to learn, and to become better disciples. Therefore, we should not rush to condemn others but imitate God's mercy and allow room for change.

The second reading from Romans gives us another source of hope. St. Paul reminds us that *"the Spirit helps us in our weakness."* Often, we do not know how to pray or how to overcome our struggles. Yet the Holy Spirit intercedes for us with sighs too deep for words. God never abandons us in our weakness; He walks with us patiently until His grace transforms us.

We are invited not to judge people quickly, be patient with ourselves, pray for those who have gone astray rather than wishing punishment upon them, and pray that they may encounter God's mercy. Trust the Holy Spirit in moments of confusion, weakness, or suffering, remember that the Spirit prays within you. Live as good wheat, in a world where evil exists, Christians are called to bear good fruit through love, forgiveness, humility, and holiness. St. Francis de Sales wisely said: *"Have patience with all things, but first of all with yourself."*

The same patient God who waits for others also waits lovingly for us. He invites us to cooperate with His grace each day.

May the Lord grant us hearts that are patient, merciful, and hopeful. May we never become discouraged by the presence of evil, but instead remain faithful, trusting that at the final harvest, God's justice and mercy will be perfectly revealed. And may the Holy Spirit continue to strengthen us until we become the good wheat gathered into the Lord's everlasting Kingdom. Amen.

Venezuela Earthquake Relief

Reflexión sobre las Escrituras

«LA PACIENCIA DE DIOS NOS DA TIEMPO PARA CAMBIAR»



Mis queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo,

La vida a menudo nos presenta personas y situaciones que ponen a prueba nuestra paciencia. Nos preguntamos por qué el mal parece prosperar mientras que los buenos lo pasan mal. Nos preguntamos por qué Dios parece retrasar su juicio. Las lecturas de hoy responden a estas preguntas con un hermoso mensaje: Dios es justo, pero también es infinitamente paciente y misericordioso. Su paciencia no es debilidad; es amor que brinda a los pecadores la oportunidad de arrepentirse.

La primera lectura, tomada del Libro de la Sabiduría, nos dice que Dios es el único Juez verdadero y que, como es todopoderoso, opta por la misericordia en lugar de la severidad. «Diste a tus hijos un buen motivo para esperar que les permitirías arrepentirse de sus pecados». La fuerza de Dios no se manifiesta destruyendo a los pecadores de inmediato, sino dándoles tiempo para volver a Él.

En el Evangelio, Jesús cuenta la parábola del trigo y la cizaña. Los siervos quieren arrancar la cizaña de inmediato, pero el señor les dice: «Dejad que ambos crezcan juntos hasta la cosecha». Esto nos enseña que solo Dios ve el corazón humano. Lo que hoy parece cizaña puede convertirse mañana en trigo fructífero. Dios espera pacientemente porque desea la conversión, no la destrucción.

Muchos de nosotros hemos cometido errores en la vida. Si Dios nos hubiera juzgado inmediatamente después de cometer nuestros pecados, ¿dónde estaríamos hoy? Su paciencia nos ha permitido crecer, aprender y convertirnos en mejores discípulos. Por eso, no debemos apresurarnos a condenar a los demás, sino imitar la misericordia de Dios y dejar margen para el cambio.

La segunda lectura de la Carta a los Romanos nos ofrece otra fuente de esperanza. San Pablo nos recuerda que «el Espíritu nos ayuda en nuestra debilidad». A menudo, no sabemos cómo rezar ni cómo superar nuestras dificultades. Sin embargo, el Espíritu Santo intercede por nosotros con gemidos que no pueden expresarse con palabras. Dios nunca nos abandona en nuestra debilidad; camina con nosotros pacientemente hasta que su gracia nos transforma.

Se nos invita a no juzgar a las personas precipitadamente, a ser pacientes con nosotros mismos, a rezar por quienes se han descarriado en lugar de desearles un castigo, y a rezar para que puedan encontrar la misericordia de Dios. Confía en el Espíritu Santo en los momentos de confusión, debilidad o sufrimiento; recuerda que el Espíritu reza en tu interior. Vive como el trigo bueno: en un mundo donde existe el mal, los cristianos están llamados a dar buenos frutos a través del amor, el perdón, la humildad y la santidad. San Francisco de Sales dijo sabiamente: «Ten paciencia con todas las cosas, pero ante todo contigo mismo».

El mismo Dios paciente que espera a los demás también nos espera con amor a nosotros. Nos invita a colaborar con su gracia cada día.

Que el Señor nos conceda corazones pacientes, misericordiosos y llenos de esperanza. Que nunca nos desanimes ante la presencia del mal, sino que, por el contrario, permanezcamos fieles, confiando en que, en la cosecha final, la justicia y la misericordia de Dios se revelarán plenamente. Y que el Espíritu Santo siga fortaleciéndonos hasta que nos convirtamos en el trigo bueno recogido en el Reino eterno del Señor. Amén.
