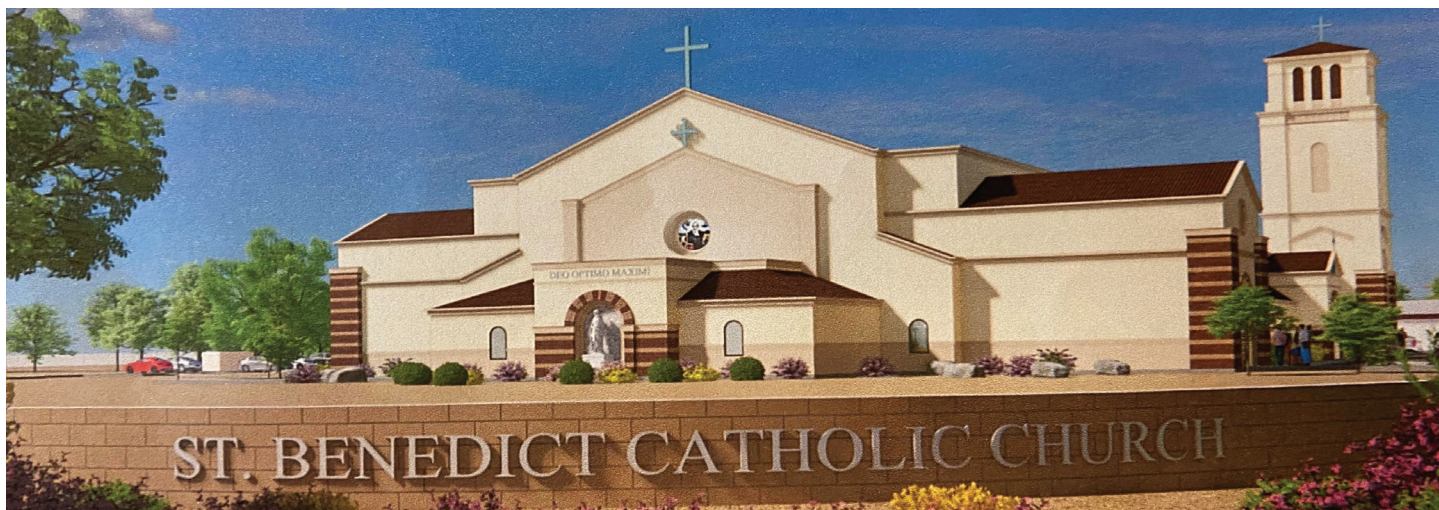

Gospel Reflection

**FROM FEAR TO FAITH:
KEEPING OUR EYES ON JESUS IN THE STORMS OF LIFE**

Dear Friends in Christ,

The readings of today speak about one reality every Christian experiences, which is storms. Elijah faces a storm of discouragement; St. Paul experiences the storm of sorrow for his people; Peter encounters a physical storm on the Sea of Galilee. Yet, beneath these outward events lies a deeper spiritual message: the greatest storm is not around us but within us. It is the storm of fear, doubt, distraction, temptation, and loss of trust in God.

In the first reading, Elijah found God in silence and not in the storms. This teaches us that God does not usually compete with the noise of the world. He speaks to hearts that are quiet enough to listen and also through our consciences. In our time we get easily distracted with our phones, social media, endless activities, anxiety, ambition, and worry. These external distractions sometimes become the internal distractions that tune down God's voice. We become like Elijah when we search for God in an extraordinary way, while ignoring Him in daily prayer, Scripture, the Eucharist, and the silence of our hearts. If we desire to hear God, we must create moments of silence and reflection. A quiet heart becomes the dwelling place of God's voice. St. Teresa of Calcutta wisely said: *"God is the friend of silence. See how nature; trees, flowers, grass, grow in silence."*

In the second reading, St. Paul invites us to carry others in prayer, even when they disappoint us (Romans 9:1-5). St. Paul expressed profound sorrow since many of his fellow Israelites had not accepted Christ. Instead of condemning them, he carried them in his heart and prayed for them. This teaches us that mature Christian love continues to hope even when others reject the truth or disappoint us. We should imitate Paul by praying, loving, and patiently witnessing to Christ. True disciples do not give up on people because Christ never gives up on us.

In the Gospel reading, we are called to see deeply that storms become more dangerous when they distract us from Jesus. The storm on the sea represents much more than bad weather. Spiritually, it symbolizes everything that threatens our relationship with Christ such as fear, and all kinds of misfortunes. Peter did something impossible because his eyes were fixed on Jesus. He walked on water not because of his own strength but because of his faith. The moment Peter shifted his attention from Jesus to the strong wind, he began to sink. We sink not because the storm is powerful, but because our focus shifts from Christ to the storm. Fear reveals our human weakness, but faith opens us to God's strength. Peter represents every one of us. He was courageous enough to step out of the boat, yet human enough to become afraid. Fear itself is not the problem. The problem is allowing fear to control our decisions. Fear often comes from: focusing on circumstances instead of Christ, doubting God's presence, trusting ourselves more than God, dwelling on failure instead of God's mercy. When fear dominates the heart, we lose confidence, we stop taking courageous steps, become anxious, our prayer weakens, hope begins to disappear. Spiritually, fear slowly paralyzes the soul and prevents us from becoming the people God calls us to be. God's mercy is greater than our failures.

Whenever we fall into sin, discouragement, anxiety, or doubt, Jesus continues to stretch out His hand through the Sacraments, His Word, prayer, and the support of the Christian community. St. John Paul II encouraged the whole Church: *"Do not be afraid. Open wide the doors to Christ."* Faith is not pretending that storms do not exist. Faith is believing that Christ is greater than every storm that exists. May we never allow fear to take our eyes away from Jesus. Amen.

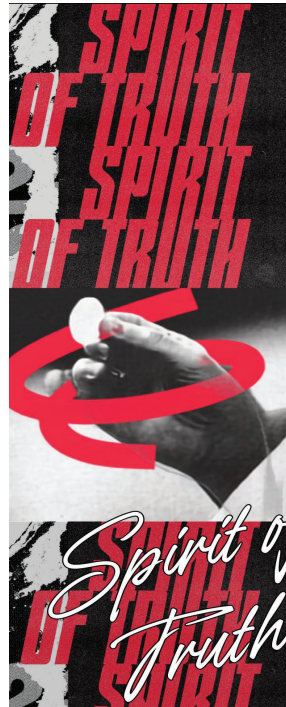

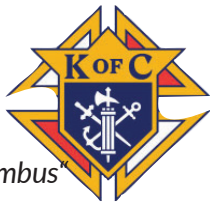

Reflexión sobre las Escrituras

DEL MIEDO A LA FE: MANTENER LA MIRADA FIJA EN JESÚS EN LAS TORMENTAS DE LA VIDA



Queridos amigos en Cristo,

Las lecturas de hoy hablan de una realidad que todo cristiano experimenta: las tormentas. Elías se enfrenta a una tormenta de desánimo; san Pablo vive la tormenta del dolor por su pueblo; Pedro se encuentra con una tormenta física en el mar de Galilea. Sin embargo, tras estos acontecimientos externos se esconde un mensaje espiritual más profundo: la mayor tormenta no está a nuestro alrededor, sino dentro de nosotros. Es la tormenta del miedo, la duda, la distracción, la tentación y la pérdida de confianza en Dios.

En la primera lectura, Elías encontró a Dios en el silencio y no en las tormentas. Esto nos enseña que Dios no suele competir con el ruido del mundo. Él habla a los corazones que están lo suficientemente en silencio como para escuchar y también a través de nuestras conciencias. En nuestra época nos distraemos fácilmente con los móviles, las redes sociales, las actividades interminables, la ansiedad, la ambición y las preocupaciones. Estas distracciones externas a veces se convierten en distracciones internas que ahogan la voz de Dios. Nos convertimos en algo parecido a Elías cuando buscamos a Dios de una manera extraordinaria, mientras lo ignoramos en la oración diaria, en las Escrituras, en la Eucaristía y en el silencio de nuestro corazón. Si deseamos escuchar a Dios, debemos crear momentos de silencio y reflexión. Un corazón tranquilo se convierte en la morada de la voz de Dios. Santa Teresa de Calcuta dijo sabiamente: «Dios es amigo del silencio. Fíjate en cómo la naturaleza —los árboles, las flores, la hierba— crece en silencio».

En la segunda lectura, san Pablo nos invita a llevar a los demás en nuestras oraciones, incluso cuando nos decepcionan (Romanos 9, 1-5). San Pablo expresó un profundo pesar porque muchos de sus compatriotas israelitas no habían aceptado a Cristo. En lugar de condenarlos, los llevaba en su corazón y rezaba por ellos. Esto nos enseña que el amor cristiano maduro sigue teniendo esperanza incluso cuando los demás rechazan la verdad o nos decepcionan. Debemos imitar a Pablo rezando, amando y dando testimonio de Cristo con paciencia. Los verdaderos discípulos no renuncian a las personas porque Cristo nunca renuncia a nosotros.

En la lectura del Evangelio, se nos invita a comprender en profundidad que las tormentas se vuelven más peligrosas cuando nos alejan de Jesús. La tormenta en el mar representa mucho más que el mal tiempo. Espiritualmente, simboliza todo aquello que amenaza nuestra relación con Cristo, como el miedo y todo tipo de desgracias. Pedro hizo algo imposible porque tenía la mirada fija en Jesús. Caminó sobre el agua no por su propia fuerza, sino por su fe. En el momento en que Pedro desvió su atención de Jesús hacia el fuerte viento, empezó a hundirse. Nos hundimos no porque la tormenta sea poderosa, sino porque nuestro enfoque se desvía de Cristo hacia la tormenta. El miedo pone de manifiesto nuestra debilidad humana, pero la fe nos abre a la fuerza de Dios. Pedro nos representa a todos y cada uno de nosotros. Fue lo suficientemente valiente como para salir de la barca, pero lo suficientemente humano como para sentir miedo. El miedo en sí mismo no es el problema. El problema es permitir que el miedo controle nuestras decisiones. El miedo suele surgir de: centrarnos en las circunstancias en lugar de en Cristo, dudar de la presencia de Dios, confiar más en nosotros mismos que en Dios, obsesionarnos con el fracaso en lugar de con la misericordia de Dios. Cuando el miedo domina el corazón, perdemos la confianza, dejamos de dar pasos valientes, nos sentimos ansiosos, nuestra oración se debilita y la esperanza empieza a desaparecer. Espiritualmente, el miedo paraliza poco a poco el alma y nos impide convertirnos en las personas que Dios nos llama a ser. La misericordia de Dios es mayor que nuestros fracasos.

Siempre que caemos en el pecado, el desánimo, la ansiedad o la duda, Jesús sigue tendiéndonos la mano a través de los sacramentos, su Palabra, la oración y el apoyo de la comunidad cristiana. San Juan Pablo II animó a toda la Iglesia: «No tengáis miedo. Abrid de par en par las puertas a Cristo». La fe no consiste en fingir que las tormentas no existen. La fe consiste en creer que Cristo es más grande que cualquier tormenta que exista. Que nunca permitamos que el miedo nos aparte la mirada de Jesús. Amén.
